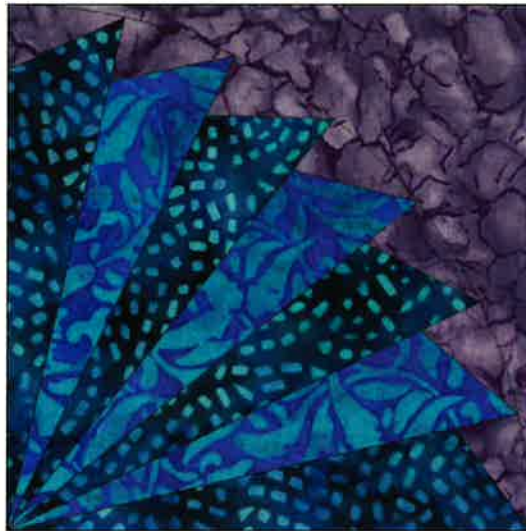
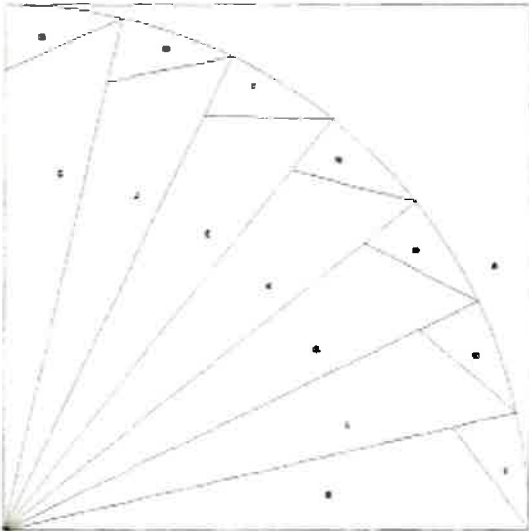


BLOCK 7 OVERLAPPING FAN



The pattern will print in 4 pages and must be taped together to get the **12.5 inch unfinished** block. Use the picture above for the proper order of the pattern pages.

IMPORTANT – when printing, make sure you set your printer to actual size – do not let the printer resize the pattern. There is also a 1-inch mark on the first page to check you scale after printing.

Remember the basic block is 12 inches. Line A is the 12” finished size. Line B is the 12.5” unfinished size and includes the ¼ inch seam allowance – do not cut this line off when you trim your pattern sections. Don’t worry about the heavy black lines (Line A) being a smidge beyond 12 inches. This will take care of itself when you trim the final block.

The 12 inch block outline does not come to the edge of the inner pages – this is where you make sure the black lines meet when you put the 4-pieces together.

Notice on the line drawing that each blade has a small piece at the top it to fill out the background before the arc is added. It is suggested that this small piece be the background color to get the wedge effect of the blades. (see color picture)

This month’s block was supposedly designed be made with templates. Put the 4 pages together before you make your templates. **Very Important! Each template much have the ¼ inch seam allowance added to it.** Piece each blade to it small top piece, the piece the blades together in order, and then add the arc at the top.

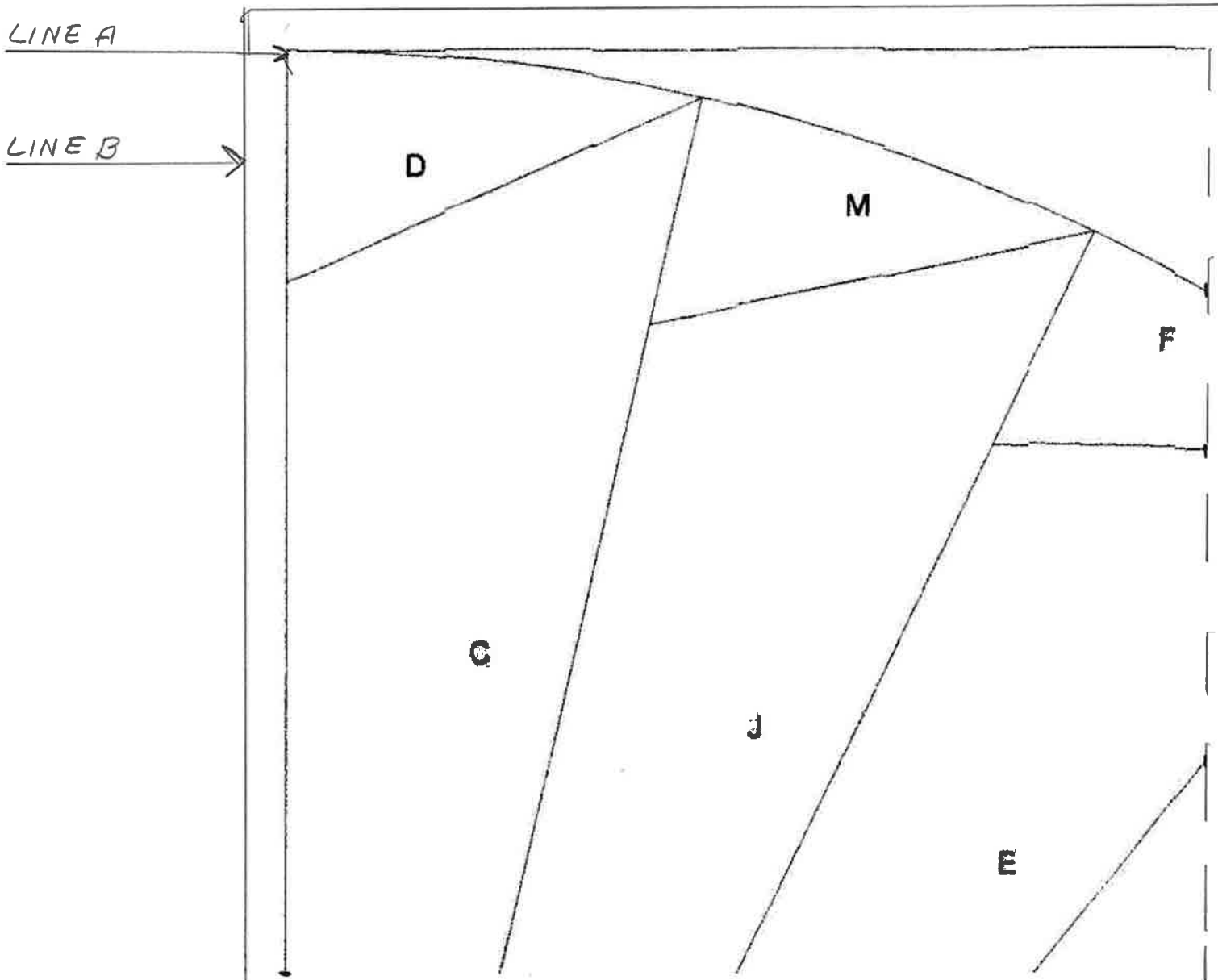
However, I do believe that it can be paper pieced if you start with the bottom blade, add the small top piece to the blade, add the next blade, the top piece for that blade, and so on to you have all blades added. Then add the arc.

Remember to let the fabric extend over the seam lines to cover the seam allowance.

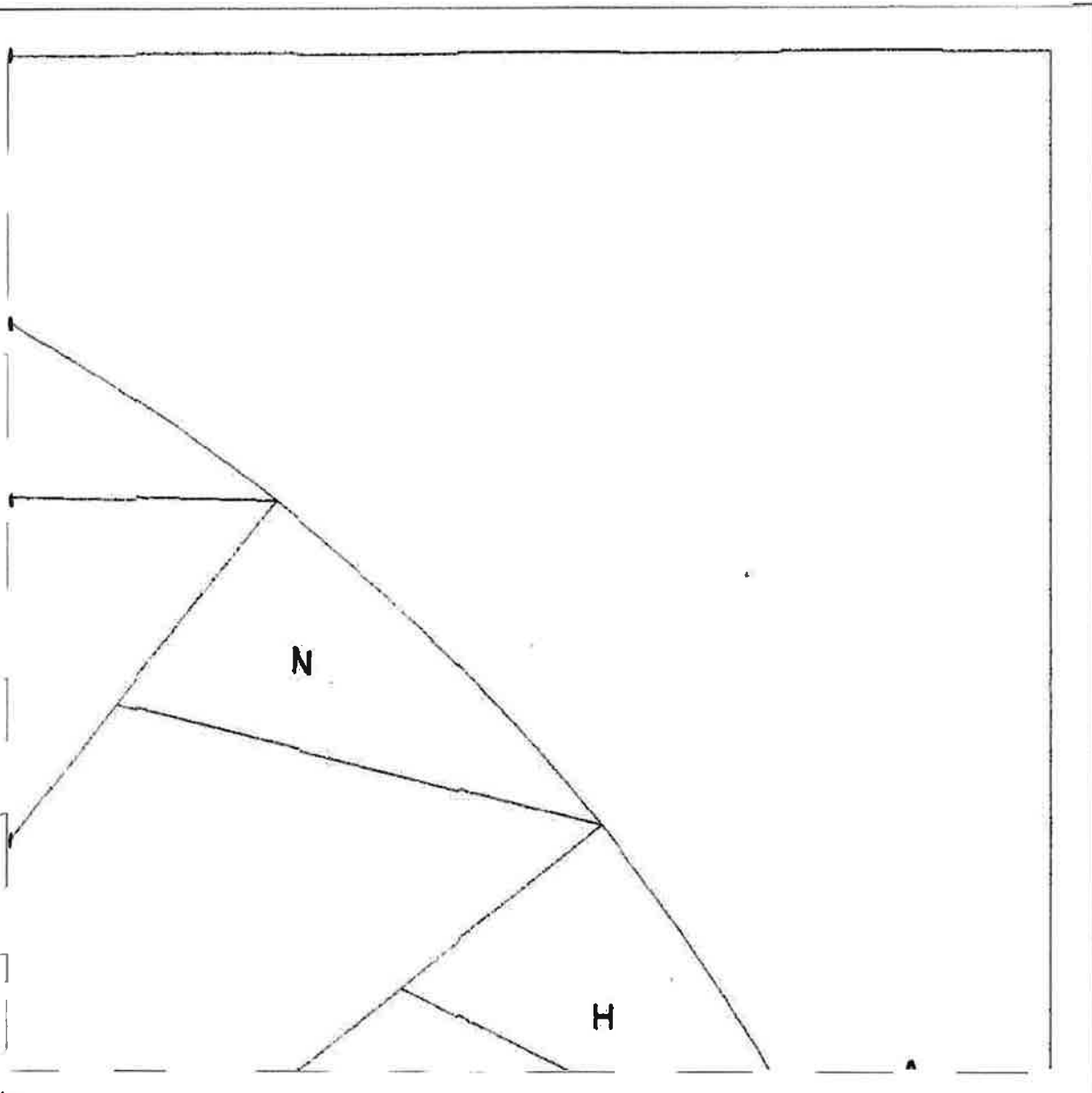
Trim the block to 12.5 inches.

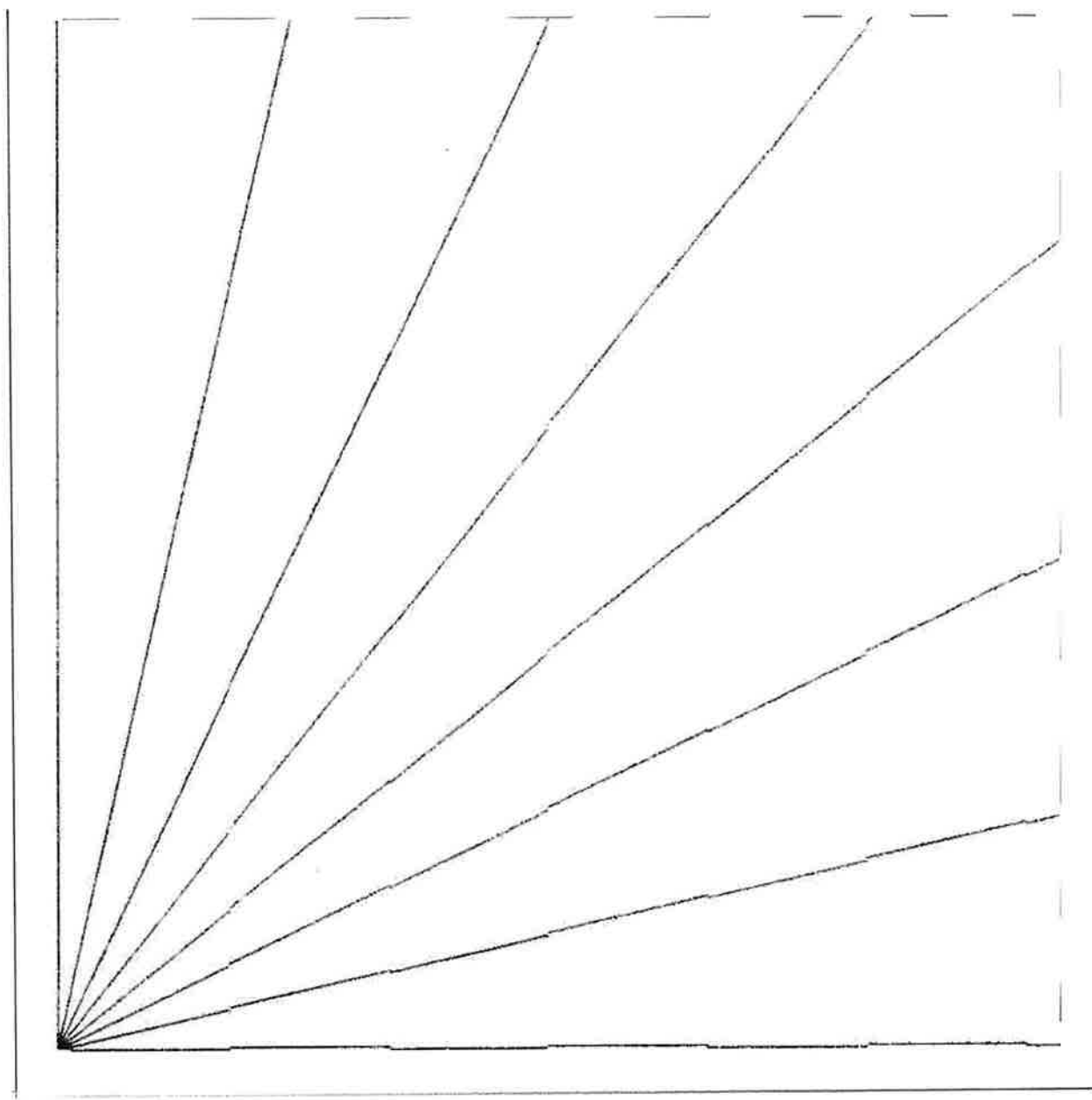

UPPER LEFT

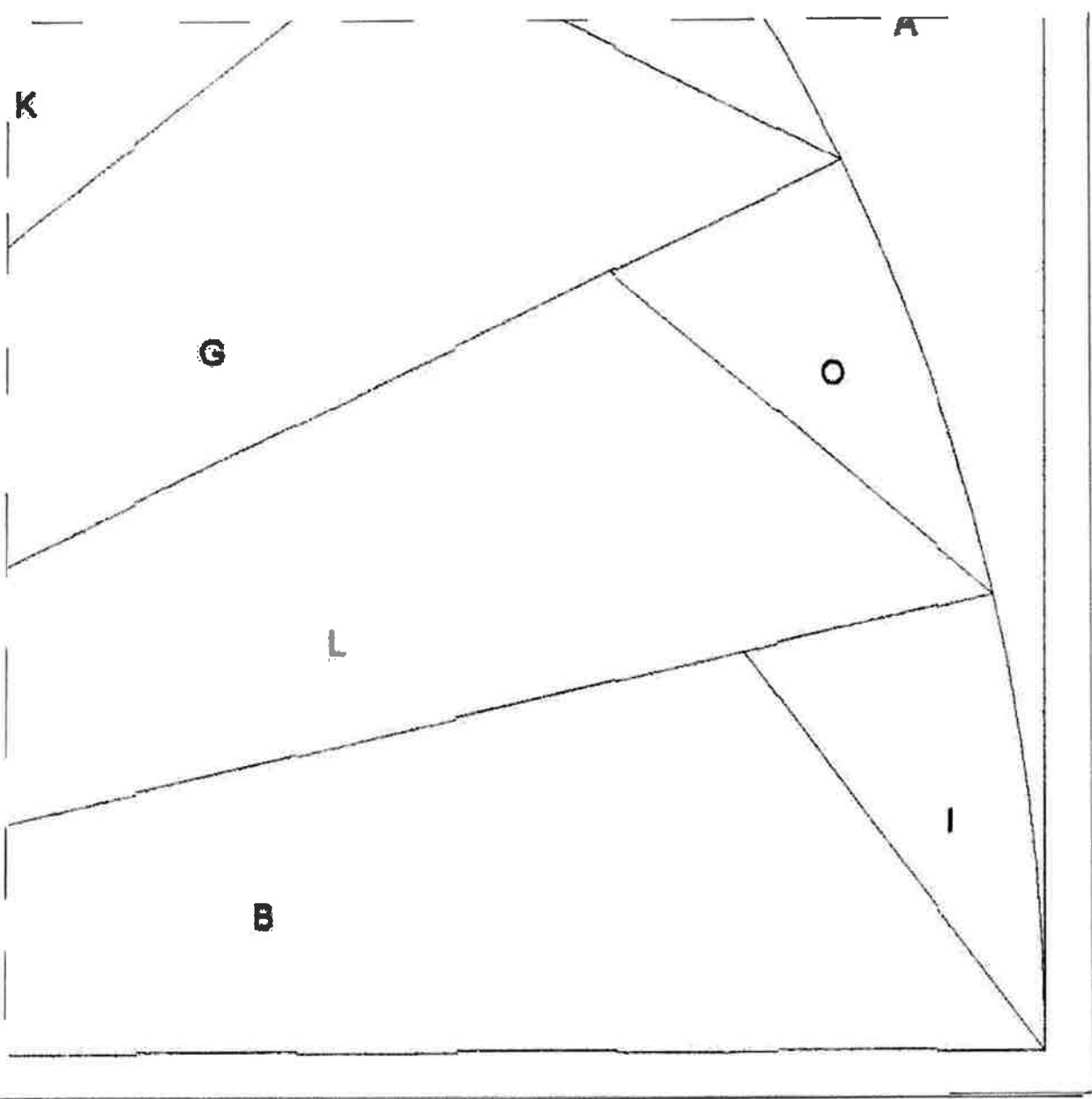


UPPER RIGHT
